Loran Award

National program, based on character, service, and leadership. Selection criteria include academic excellence, community and extracurricular involvement. There are 36 major financial awards, valued at up to \$100,000 and tenable at 25 universities listed [here](#). There are also 54 finalist (\$6000) and 70 provincial awards (\$3000). There are summer work experience opportunities, and scholar gatherings as well as lifelong membership in this community. Lester B. Pearson International Student Scholarship

The scholarship program is to recognize International students who plan to attend University of Toronto who demonstrate exceptional academic achievement, creativity, and leaders within their school community. This scholarship will cover the cost of tuition, books, incidental fees, and full residence support for 4 years. To be eligible, you must be an international student, graduating from high school by June 2026, and beginning studies at University of Toronto in September 2026. To be considered for this scholarship, you must be nominated by the school.

Interested candidates can share a 1-2 page (point form is acceptable) overview of academic achievements, examples of personal creativity and innovation, and how you have (and continue to) contributed as a positive leader at the school to their colour community guidance counsellor by **Friday, October 3rd**. For the National Book Award, each school may choose one outstanding student based on criterion shared below. The national book award will be presented to the student and they may subsequently apply for the National Scholarship Competition. To be considered for scholarship, please share 1-2 page outline to your colour community guidance counsellor based on how you have demonstrated the following criteria: academic

excellence; original and creative thought; enthusiasm for intellectual exploration; exceptional achievement in a broad context; and involvement in extracurricular activities within school and in the community throughout high school. Point form is acceptable. Use your imagination (ie. Some students have used images/art work, etc.). Scholarship application to guidance counsellor is due by **Friday, October 3rd, 2025.**

Wolf Scholars

Wolf Scholars is a transformative scholarship program designed to develop Canada's next generation of thoughtful builders, innovators, and leaders.

Each year, 16 exceptional incoming undergraduates across the University of Toronto's Faculty of Arts & Science will form a tight-knit cohort. Over four years, Scholars will engage in an enrichment program designed to sharpen their critical thinking skills, foster their intellectual curiosity across disciplines, and prepare them to tackle the challenges facing their generation.

Beyond funded travel and leadership development experiences, Scholars will receive a full tuition scholarship and a meaningful living stipend.

Eligibility

- Must be in final year of high school diploma
- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Minimum Cumulative 90% academic average in your last completed year of high school
- You must apply to the Faculty of Arts Science at the St. George Campus through OUAC by the early admission deadline of **November 7th, 2025**

This scholarship honours the memory of Anna and John Kolesar, the parents of Dr. Henry Kolesar, Deputy Minister of Alberta Advanced Education from 1976 to 1987.
